Making the Detailed DHC-A Data Accessible





Goals

- Make the Detailed Demographic and Housing Characteristics File A (DDHC-A) data accessible
 - data.census.gov isn't always easy to use and accessing the DDHC-A is particularly challenging
- Opportunity to educate data users on how to use data

Presentation of data

Low tech excel spreadsheets

- Readme (reference information and links)
- DHC data
- Detailed DHC-A data counts and percentages
 - Use DHC race/ethnicity totals as denominator for within race/ethnicity percentages
 - Use regional totals as denominator for regional percentages
 - Present "alone" counts side by side with "alone and in combination" counts

Educate

Different 2020 Census datasets and what can be found where

- Redistricting data
- Demographic and Housing Characteristics file (DHC)
- Detailed Demographic and Housing Characteristics file (Detailed DHC-A)

Educate

Disclosure Avoidance

- DHC/Redistricting and Detailed DHC-A data are not consistent
- Nesting geographies within the Detailed DHC-A are not consistent
- Regional groups will not sum to total population
- Detailed groups will not sum to regional categories

Educate

Methodology details- in addition to disclosure avoidance

- A person selecting multiple categories within a regional group will not be listed under the detailed categories for "alone" count, but will be listed under the regional "alone" count. That person will be listed in all alone and in combination counts.
- A person can be listed under a regional category (such a European), without being counted under a detailed category under "alone" or "alone or in combination"
- For Hispanic detailed categories, the Census Bureau only publishes one detailed category per individual (no matter how many were listed on the census form).

Education

Data will be suppressed if meeting either of following criteria:

- Noise-infused count was negative
- The count for 'alone' is larger than its equivalent 'alone or in any combination' count

Education

Minimum Thresholds

- State- all categories with counts will be shown unless they meet criteria for suppression
- County
 - Detailed categories need to have a population count of 22 or more to be shown
 - Regional categories need to have a population count of 94 or more to be shown

Education

Margins of error

- State
 - Detailed categories have MOE +/- 3
 - Regional categories have MOE +/- 50
- County
 - Detailed categories have MOE +/- 11
 - Regional categories have MOE +/- 50

Population Estimates by Massachusetts Geography

Each year, the U.S. Census Bureau produces population estimates at the state, county, and city/town level. These population estimates are used for federal funding allocations, as controls for major surveys, for community development, and as denominators for calculating statistical rates, among other uses. More information about the methodology used by the Census Bureau to produce these estimates can be found at the Census website.

With each Census release, PEP produces a summary report on the estimates for Massachusetts. These reports extract the data for Massachusetts from the Census release and provide context about population trends for researchers and planners. The most recent PEP reports on population estimates for Massachusetts, its counties, and its cities/towns may be viewed by clicking the desired level of geography above or in the menu to the left.

Census 2020 Data for Massachusetts

The U.S. Census Bureau released the first detailed dataset from the Census 2020 count on August 12, 2021. This "Decennial Census P.L. 94-171 Redistricting" dataset includes population counts by race and ethnicity in two age groups including under-18 and 18-plus as well as housing unit counts by occupancy status. The full PL-94 dataset encompasses Census count information for geographic levels including state, county, tract, block-group, block, and congressional-district. On this webpage UMDI has developed interactive data dashboards to display the Census 2020 population totals, population change, population by race and ethnicity, and housing unit information at the city and town level. Scroll below the dashboards to find a link to individualized municipal summaries and downloadable tables. 




